<p><b>24</b> <b>Make Cookies:</b></p> <p>Help your child make cookies and if you celebrate Christmas, put them out for Santa.</p>	<p><b>25</b> <b>Hug 10 people &amp; Count your Treats</b></p> <p>*Help your child use the treat counter on the back to keep track of how many special treats your child eats today.</p>	<p><b>26</b> <b>Make it Snow!</b></p> <p>Rip or cut your used wrapping paper into tons of small pieces and throw them in the air. Both ripping and cutting are great fine motor practice!</p>	<p><b>27</b> <b>Write Thank You Cards:</b></p> <p>Have your child draw the pictures and dictate the messages.</p>	<p><b>28</b> <b>Foot Print Fun</b></p> <p>Go out in the snow or find a puddle and make footprints on the sidewalk. Compare by length and width, measure them with found objects (i.e. 5 acorns long) and make silly paths.</p>
<p><b>31</b> <b>Play with Shaving Cream</b></p> <p>Play with shaving cream making shapes, letters and designs. It's also fun to drive cars through shaving cream roads.</p>	<p><b>1</b> <b>Play the Tree Balance Game</b></p> <p>Use tape to make a tree on the floor for your child to balance on. See the picture on the back for an example.</p>	<p><b>2</b> <b>Do an indoor Scavenger Hunt</b></p> <p>*Find the items on the scavenger hunt list (see back for list).</p>	<p><b>3</b> <b>Skate Indoors</b></p> <p>Use empty Kleenex boxes as pretend skates. They will slide on most carpets.</p>	<p><b>4</b> <b>Do an outdoor Scavenger Hunt</b></p> <p>Find the items on the scavenger hunt list (see back for list).</p>
